Subject: Guidelines for de-notification of Red/Containment Zones.

Government Order No. 63-JK (DMRRR) of 2020. Dated: 24.06.2020

- Whereas, the State Executive Committee vide its Order No. 38-JK (DMRRR) of 2020 dated 14.04.2020 notified a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP)to be followed in the "Red/Containment Zones" by the concerned authorities of the Government; and
- 2) Whereas, the said SOP laid down in detail the strategy to impose complete lockdown, guidelines for undertaking full Health screening and surveillance, facilitation of essential supplies and handling medical emergencies etc. in the notified Red/Containment zone; and
- Whereas, it is also imperative now to lay down certain uniform guidelines for de-notification of the Containment/Red Zones
- 4) Now, therefore, in exercise of powers conferred upon me, in my capacity as Chairperson of State Executive Committee, under Section 24 of the Disaster management Act, 2005, the guidelines annexed with this Order are notified as the guidelines to be followed for de-notifying an existing "Red/Containment Zone" by the Deputy Commissioner concerned.

GUIDELINES FOR DENOTIFICATION OF RED ZONES / CONTAINMENT ZONES

- Containment Zones/Red Zones have been notified by Deputy Commissioners based on the COVID-19 positive cases in specific areas and for which the Containment Zone/ Red Zone SOP issued vide Government Order No. 38-JK(DMRRR) of 2020 dated 14.04.2020 is being followed.
- All districts need to follow a uniform approach for de-notification of Containment Zones/Red Zonesin order to ensure effective control of the COVID-19 infection both in these zones and in the neighborhood.

CRITERIA TO BE FULFILLED FOR DENOTIFICATION OF CONTAINMENT ZONES/ RED ZONES

- 3. Intensive Testing: Prior to de-notification, sampling and testing using RTPCR testing should be undertaken and completed for the following groups between the 14th to 21st day from the date of notification of the Zone:
 - a. <u>All vulnerable persons to be tested</u> including those with comorbidities, pregnant women, those above 50 years of age, those with ILI/ SARI symptoms, etc. Swasthya Nidhi will be used for identification of vulnerable persons.
 - b. <u>Active Surveillance</u> with at least three door to door visits for ILI (Influenza like Illness) and SARI (Severe Acute Respiratory Illness) cases in the notified Red zone, ideally once every week. Swasthya Nidhi will be used for surveillance.
 - All service providers residing in and <u>health care workers</u> attending to people in the Containment Zone/Red Zone.
 - d. At least 50% of the remaining residents of the Red Zone.

- 4. Role of Epidemiological investigation: Epidemiological investigation by RRT teams should confirm the source of infection or identify the index cases in the notified Red Zone area and this should rule out any other hidden transmission in the said zone as well as probability of any missing case/ Contacts.
- No Case for 21 days: There should be no confirmed COVID positive case in the Containment Zone/ Red Zone, other than that of a traveler who is in quarantine from hois date of arrival in the zone, for 21 days after the notification of the Containment Zone/ Red Zone.
- Partial De-notification: On fulfillment of the above two criteria, the Containment Zone/Red Zone can be partially de-notified on the 22nd day.
- 7. Follow up Random Sampling: Random samples of 10% of the residents shall again be done from the 25th to 30th day.
- 8. Full De-notification: If there are no more confirmed COVID positive cases, the Containment Zone/Red Zone will be fully de-notified. This would mean that the Zone has had no positive case for 30 days.

RENOTIFICATION OF CONTAINMENT ZONES/ RED ZONES

9. Renotification: If a positive case is again reported from the Containment Zone/ Red Zone during the random sampling phase or earlier, it shall again be re-notified once again as a Containment Zone/ Red Zone and the SOP for these zones will be implemented again in toto. The partial de-notification and full de-notification can be done only after there is a clear gap of 21 days and 30 days respectively from the last positive case detected in the Zone.
